Help for Ukraine

Along with much of the world, we at CARITAS have watched with shock and dismay as events have unfolded in Ukraine that resulted in the displacement of so many people from their homes. Many people have fled to the neighboring country of Poland, and are being welcomed there

with open arms – but the organizations and ministries who are caring for the Ukrainian refugees badly need support to be able to provide the necessary resources for them.

Some may not be aware of this, but the inspiration for the ministry which eventually became CARITAS For Children began when our founders, Chris and Barbara Hoar, adopted two children from an orphanage in Poland run by the Little Servant Sisters. Since our official

Thanks to the support of so many, we have been

enabled to once again offer these wonderful women assistance as the demands for their ministry services have drastically and suddenly increased. The Little Servant Sisters are offering hospitality and shelter to women and children refugees in Przemysl, and other centers with their General House in Stara Wies, near Brzozow. Their focus is to provide places of welcome,

spiritual and psychological support, shelter, food, clothing, basic necessities as well as medicine, child products, and games. They are also working with their other centers in Poland to discover what more can be done as the situation seems intensifies, and more Ukrainians flee their country.

In addition, the Sisters have over 25 members of their religious congregation stationed in 10 houses in Ukraine. With firm faith and hope in God, **they have decided to stay in Ukraine and are courageously helping the people under siege** during the Russian invasion. As they care for the shocked and desperate citizens, our Sisters will require

prayerful support and funds to help them in their service to those who remain with them in Ukraine, and for those who are fleeing to Poland.

In little more than two weeks, our CARITAS

Family has responded with astounding generosity to aid the Sisters in their courageous efforts in Poland and Ukraine. We are amazed and so grateful to each and every person who has made this possible – but the need is ongoing!

The CARITAS website has several new features as we continue to focus on improving and upgrading our software and communication tools. Here are some of the most recent and timely updates.

TAX DOCUMENTS ONLINE

These are the steps to get your tax documents right from your account:

- Log in to your account, then go to "My Giving".
- Scroll down the page to "Tax Documents"
- Click the button that says, "View or Print My Giving Statement".
- To view the previous year, click "Show Filters", then click "Contribution Date" and select "Previous Year".
- Click on the three lines to the right of your total. Choose "Print Statements" to download a .pdf version or click on "Email Statement" to have it emailed to you.

We plan to make this an even easier process with fewer steps in the future. If you have any issues with this, please know that you can always contact us, and we will manually send you your documents.


CHAT WITH CARITAS ONLINE

Spotlight on Children in Need

Sponsorship for education at the Teresa Toda Orphanage will change the lives of these girls from the Dominican Republic!

Esmeralda and her older sister have suffered abuse and mistreatment at home but thankfully their uncle rescued them from their harmful situation. Their father cannot take care of them, and their mother is a street woman. They were living with a couple who abused the girls, and in addition, their neighborhood was full of drugs, extreme poverty, prostitution and vandalism – no place for young girls to grow up in.

Recognizing that the girls cannot go back to their old living situation, the Sisters have let the girls live at the Orphanage in hopes that we can find sponsors for them soon. This will give Esmeralda a chance at a much better future, and she hopes to become a teacher when she grows up.

Lizbeth was living with her sister Lismairi and their father Domingo. Their mother died a couple years ago, leaving Mr. Domingo to raise the two girls alone.

Recognizing that the Sisters could take better care of his girls than he could, Lizbeth's father requested that they be removed to the Orphanage because he feared for his daughters' safety in their neighborhood. He has to go to work every day and leave them alone.

The Sisters have let the girls remain while awaiting sponsors (thankfully Lizbeth's sister has already received one), which will enable Lizbeth to get a good education and build a better life for herself. She is interested in becoming a doctor when she grows up.
